



Safety Tips

1. **Dress Properly.** Wear long pants, long-sleeved shirts, close-fitting clothes, no jewelry, sturdy shoes with slip-resistant rubber soles, eye protection, heavy gloves, and hearing protection.
2. **Before starting up your machinery,** remove objects from areas that could cause injury or damage equipment, such as sticks, metal, wire, and glass.
3. **Make sure safety devices on your equipment are properly in place before starting work.** These devices can include a ROPS bar, seatbelt, or guards.
4. **Take the necessary safety precautions when children are around.**
5. **Unplug electrical tools** and disconnect spark plug wires on gas-powered tools before making adjustments or clearing jams near moving parts.
6. **Handle gas carefully.** Never fill gasoline tanks while machinery is on or when equipment is still hot. Wipe up spills. Store gas away from the house. Never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline or gasoline-powered equipment.
7. **Never work with electrical power tools in wet or damp conditions.**
8. **Make sure that extension cords are in good condition,** are rated for outdoor use, and are the proper gauge for the electrical current capacity of the tool you are using.
9. **Inspect your equipment periodically for potential hazards,** such as loose belts, missing or damaged guards, and accumulation of grass, leaves, or excessive grease to reduce fire hazards.
